## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### — In the context of easing lockdown restrictions starting on November 28, 2020, which establishments can open, and which are still forced to remain closed?

A [decree](#) published on November 28<sup>th</sup>, 2020, modifies the decree of October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2020, detailing the general measures to halt the spread of the pandemic.

Given the positive evolution of the sanitary situation, a vast majority of establishments, previously closed, can open again.

This reopening must be done in compliance with a reinforced sanitary protocol, which indicates the commitments allowing the reopening of these businesses, reconciling economic activity and the protection of the population's health. Therefore, all shops can now open except for the following:

- Hearing rooms, conference halls, meeting rooms, performance halls, and multi-purpose auditoriums (e.g. cinemas).
- Auction houses.
- Courtrooms.
- Restaurants and public houses, except for their delivery and take-away activities, the "room service" of hotel restaurants and bars and contract catering.
- Tourist residences, campsites (except for persons whose regular place of residence is a campsite).
- Dance halls and gambling halls.
- Bookshops, documentation centers.
- Exhibition halls.
- Indoor sports/leisure facilities.
- Outdoor sports facilities (except for of high-level sportsmen and women, school groups, people with a medical prescription, for the organization of health screenings, etc.).
- Museums.
