## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### **Can employees be vaccinated at their workplace?**

Occupational health services, which are essential in the fight against the spread of Covid-19, can implement workplace screening and vaccination measures, with regards to the recommendations of the High Authority of Health.

As of February 25th, 2021, and according to the recommendations of the High Authority of Health of February 2nd, 2021, occupational physicians can currently provide vaccination to voluntary employees, aged from 55 to 64 or those presenting comorbidities.

The procedures for implementing these actions are evolutionary and defined alongside the Ministry of Solidarity and Health and the Ministry of Labor. Companies are invited to regularly consult the information published by the competent authorities: [click here](#)

### **Spreading of information**

Employers are encouraged to inform their employees about the possibility of being vaccinated by the company's occupational health service when possible. This information must be broadcasted to all employees regardless of their age, while mentioning the targeting of the national strategy (including those aged 55 to 64 with comorbidities according to the guidelines set to date by the competent national authorities). This information may also be broadcasted by occupational health services, which may target employees who may be affected.

### **Management of the cost of vaccination**

The annual contribution to the inter-company occupational health service covers all necessary visits. Consequently, the vaccine appointment does not add any financial burden on the employer.

Vaccines are provided free of charge by the state. Occupational health services provide assistance in terms of health professionals and logistics.
