_ FRENCH EXPORTS TO JAPAN

In 2019, 11,700 providers exported to Japan from France. The value of their exports was €6.6 billion (1.4% of all French exports).

Japanese economic growth slowed in 2019 (+0.7%). Against this backdrop, the growth in French exports to Japan continued apace by 16.7% in 2019, reaching a historic high of

With its share in French exports growing to 1.6%, Japan was France's twelfth largest customer in 2019, receiving 11% of French exports to Asia.

France accounted for 1.7% of global exports to Japan in 2019, lower than its share in global goods exports (3.2%). France was Japan's second largest European supplier in 2019, after Germany. (cf. Fig. 1).


BREAKDOWN BY SECTOR OF FRENCH EXPORTS TO JAPAN

The leading sectors for French exports to Japan in 2019 were transport equipment (28% of the total), agri-food (16%) and machinery and equipment (13%). (cf. Fig. 2)

Carried by very strong growth in aviation deliveries (+176%), the amount of exports in the transport equipment sector doubled in 2019 compared with the previous year. Other sectors displayed good performances, such as textiles and clothing (+15%) or beverages (+10%), with an increase of 16% in sales of champagne to Japan in 2019.


After growing strongly in 2018 (+13.3%), exports of agricultural products fell sharply in 2019 (-12%). For the second successive year, pharmaceutical product exports to this market were also down sharply (-13%).

_ CONTRIBUTION OF JAPANESE SUBSIDIARIES IN FRANCE TO THE FRENCH ECONOMY

In 2018, more than 449 Japanese subsidiaries in France exported part of their output. Together, these exports amounted to €9.7 billion and accounted, on average, for 24% of total company revenues. These firms exported primarily to European markets, with Germany and Belgium receiving onethird of exports of Japanese subsidiaries in France

Japanese subsidiaries:

- /Employed 98,600 people, 5% of the workforce of all foreign-owned companies in France. (INSEE)
- / Accounted for 5% of the revenues of all foreign-owned companies in France. (Orbis)
- / Generated 6% of the export revenues of all foreign-owned companies in France. (Orbis)
